From King of Prussia/Schuylkill Expressway

From Route 202 take 422 West via Exit 328A towards Pottstown/Swedestord Road. Stay on 422 W for approximately 33.2 miles. The Reading Country Club will be on the right hand side of the road.

From PA Turnpike

Take the PA Turnpike to the Morgantown Expressway (I-176) via the ramp on the left. Follow I-176 north approximately 12 miles. Follow I-176 and merge onto US 422-E via Exit 11A towards Pottstown. Stay on 422 E (Ben Franklin Highway) for approximately 1 mile and the Reading Country Club will be on the left hand side of the highway. (This is a divided highway, you will have to proceed to the next traffic light and make your way in the right direction).

From Interstate 78

Take I-81 (US 322) and at exit 89 take ramp onto I-78/Allentown. Continue on I-78 for 18.6 miles and take Exit 19 onto PA 183/Strausstown. Continue on 183 for 14.4 miles and take a right onto US 222. Once you are on US 222 you will stay to the left and it will become 422 E - Pottstown. Follow 422 E for approximately 8.2 miles and the Reading Country Club will be on the left hand side of the road. (This is a divided highway, you will have to proceed to the next traffic light and make your way in the right direction).

Reading Country Club was chartered by the Court of Common Pleas of Berks County, Pennsylvania, on June 6, 1922, as a corporation not for profit. The club purchased 237 acres of land, consisting of two farms and four additional tracts of land in Exeter Township. The golf course, consisting of nine holes, was laid out by renowned architect, Alexander Findlay, and opened in 1923. A second nine opened for play in 1926. The present clubhouse was completed in 1931. In 1937, Byron Nelson was hired as the club's golf professional. He arrived at Reading Country Club in 1937 right after winning the Masters. Exeter Township completed its purchase of the golf course in January 2006 and recently approved the hiring of Billy Casper Golf to manage the facility. Reading Country Club is now open to the public, providing excellent golfing opportunities and event space to the region.
