President's Message

As the Chapter's year is coming to an end, I would like to thank our Officers and Directors for their time and effort to make the year a success. At our membership monthly meetings we enjoyed a number of excellent presentations including designing food-processing equipment, Kansas City Hyatt walkway collapse and arc flash in the work place. December gave us the opportunity to visit Parx Race Track for Harve Knatiuk Annual Race Day. This year is the first year of the Chapter's affiliation with the Villanova University Student Chapter of NSPE. VUNSPE invitation to a joint meeting at the University helped build a bond between the chapters and demonstrated the overwhelming student interest in professional engineering. MathCounts is an institution for the Valley Forge Chapter PSPE. Students of the grades 6th, 7th and 8th gather in a local school on a cold day in February or March to apply their skills in a mathematic competition. This year the Bucks County/Valley Forge PSPE Chapters sent 10 students to the State Championship. Winners of the State Championship move onto the National Championship in Washington DC.

This spring the Chapter continued the affiliation with student activities. Chapter members attended the Montgomery County Science Fair and Delaware Valley Science Fair to judge the Engineering Category. The student interest in these STEM science fairs is stronger than ever. The DVSF had over 1000 project entries. Project themes in the engineering category varied including testing of materials, structural designs, alternate fuel applications and more. Scholarships are another action item on the Chapter's annual agenda. Two Universities collaborate with the Chapter for scholarships. This year two students were awarded \$5000/yr from Drexel University and one student awarded \$2000/yr from Temple University. In addition the Chapter awarded these three students \$200.

To end the year with a great shot, the Reading Valley Forge Annual Golf Outing is on June 13th at Hickory Valley Golf Club (see flyer below). If you enjoy the game, you will enjoy this outing. As we move into the new chapter year (June 1, 2013-May31, 2014), I ask you to support the Chapter Board and it's program, which will include interesting presentations, factory tours and entertainment. If you would like to offer a personal influence on the Chapter's activities, we would welcome you to join the Board of Directors.

I wish you all a warm and wonderful summer. I hope to see you in the fall.

Science Fairs 2013

Well members, once again a few of your representatives on the board reported to the Greater Philadelphia Expo Center in Oaks to judge the Delaware Valley Science Fair.

The event was held on April 3, 2013 and as always these kids amazed our judges with a wide range of projects demonstrating future promise in the field of engineering. This year's fair was the largest ever with close to 1,100 total projects. The three judges from the chapter included Randy Cleaver, Tony Dougherty, and Kurt Leininger and we evaluated 91 projects in the Engineering Category. As in years past, the event consists of 5 fairs spanning the grade levels, 12th, 11th, 10th, 9th, and one fair for grades 6th through 8th. Each fair (grade level) was reviewed separately and the winner in each grade level received the Valley Forge Chapter award for engineering achievement. In addition, a second place prize for innovative engineering was awarded. The winners of these awards are as follows:
